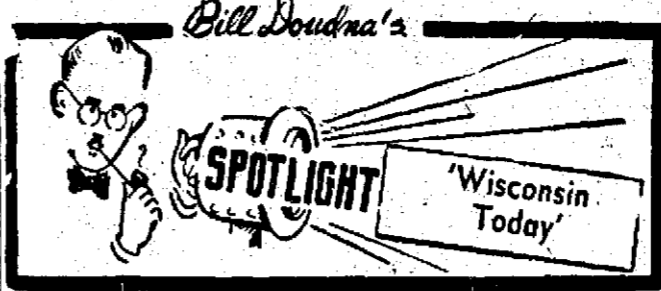

A pictorial record of "Wisconsin Today" will go on exhibition Nov. 15 at the State Historical museum in the second annual photographic show with that title. A total of \$200 in purchase awards will be given, and the State Historical society will pay \$5 each for non-winning entries which it wants to add to its permanent collection.

Judges will give prizes in three classes — Documentary photographs, pictorial photographs, and color prints and transparencies. Awards will be \$25 for first, \$20 for second, and \$15 for third in each group. In addition, two honorable mentions of \$10 each will be given in the black-and-white divisions.

Competition will be open to all photographers — professional and amateur, resident and non-resident. Subject matter must portray a base of "Wisconsin Today."

Entry forms must reach the society by Oct. 26 and photographs by Nov. 2. There will be no entry fee. The forms can be obtained from Kenneth R. Hopkins, curator of exhibits, State Historical society, 816 State st.

**Oshkosh Farmer Accused of Burning Wife with Torch**  
OSHKOSH — (U.P.) — The state charged Tuesday afternoon that a 44-year-old farmer, fired his wife with a blowtorch and threatened her with a homemade gun.

Mrs. Martha Erickson, 42, was not seriously hurt. But her husband, Selmer, was wounded in the groin when the gun discharged accidentally. Sheriff's Lieut. Harry Krippner said.

Erickson, who was committed to a state mental hospital last year, was charged with assault with intent to do great bodily harm. He was held in jail under \$25,000 bail to await a hearing Friday.

Krippner said Erickson forced his wife into the basement of their farmhouse Monday morning, tied her hands and feet with clothesline, and took off her clothes. He said Erickson started to burn her with a blowtorch, but it soon went out and the farmer pulled a homemade revolver from his overalls.

The gun exploded, wounding Erickson, the lieutenant said.

Mrs. Erickson, who suffered a slight burn on the abdomen and rope burns on the arms, is recovering at home.

Krippner said the Ericksons moved to a farm near here from Dunn county in western Wisconsin a few months ago. Erickson was committed to Mendota state hospital at Madison from Dunn county court a year ago. Dr. Walter Urben, hospital superintendent, said Erickson ran away from the hospital last November.
