Football on the Air

**TIP O' THE MORNING:** While the University of Wisconsin band will still be in its 10 year-old uniforms this season, watch for some fancy additions when they step out on the gridiron.

Two high school and two college football games will be broadcast this week by Madison stations.

WIBA-FM will carry the Central-Kenosha battle at 7:25 p. m. Friday. The East-Janesville tilt will be on WFOV at 7:30 p. m. Friday.

On Saturday, WIBA and WIBA-FM will have Yale vs. Bates at 12:30 p. m. The Michigan State-Oregon State game will be on WISC, WISC-FM and WLS at 12:45 p. m. and on WBBM at 12:55 p. m.

**BARBERSHOP:** Announcements about "Harvest of Harmony" at East and West high schools Saturday night have emphasized the fact that the same quartets will sing in both concerts, but there seems to be some confusion about it among readers.

Both programs will start at 8, and the singers will shuttle between the two buildings.

J. B. Hermesen, member of the board of directors of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America, will preside at West high, and E. W. Warrington, past president of the Land of Lakes district, will be in charge at East.

The Madison chapter chorus will open the West high show, and the Sweet Adelines chorus will start the East high performances. Each chorus will appear in only one concert.
