WATCH THOSE CURVES WARNS SAFETY REPORT

CHICAGO (AP)—You may find taking a turn on two wheels very exhilarating, but you can kill yourself and others very easily by doing so. W. Dean Keffer, director of safety engineering for the Kmetz insurance group, says a recent study in 26 states indicated that 11 per cent of the fatal accidents occurred when a motor vehicle left the road at a curve and either overturned or struck a fixed object, another vehicle or a pedestrian.

Many motorists who drive at excessive speeds make the additional mistake of waiting until they are on a curve before slowing down," he continued.

Keffer explained that to make a turn properly a motorist should slow down before entering the curve and then accelerate slightly as the vehicle rounds the curve. The driving power in the rear wheels makes steering more effective and helps keep the vehicle under control.
