### Bill Tusher Moving His Daily Program to Liberty

HOLLYWOOD. ABC's loss probably will prove to be a major gain for the Liberty Broadcasting System, whose Southern California outlet is the powerful 50,000-watt KMPC. Liberty is best known for its "live" and recreated major league baseball games which pulled the neophyte network into prominence in the last few years.

Hollywood Commentator William Tusher, who has brought a welcome note of common sense to movieland reporting, moves over to the 450-station network in an omnibus deal involving five daily shows, and the resumption of his Sunday night program, "William Tusher in Hollywood," which earned for Tusher the respect of sacharine-tweary listeners alike and an unjustly maligned industry ally.

Aside from the baseball broadcasts, Liberty has not been too active in the general entertainment field of network radio, and this move might be the indicated spark of badly needed overall improvement.

Tusher will do a daily program for the net beginning Monday, Oct. 15, and his Sunday show kicks off at the new kilocycle slot on Sunday, Oct. 21, at 8 p. m. over KMPC, locally.

The daily show, "The Human Side of Hollywood," will be aired from 9:45 to 10 a. m., Monday through Friday. Each day he will feature commentary with a guest movie star, rounding out the show with anecdotes and last minute Hollywood news, of the informative, but nonvicious type.

Bill, in his Sunday show, will continue the ad lib, unchoreographed interviews, which reflect intelligence and common sense on the part of the star, and not the
