Don't Let Children Pick Scabs; It Can Lead to Impetigo

Don't let your child pick off that scab under his fingernails may lead straight to the common skin disease — impetigo. This disease starts when germs get into the skin through scratches, cuts, or openings from "picking." It's common, because the streptococcus or staphylococcus germs are found on everyone's skin. All you need is a little skin opening to pick up impetigo.

You'll recognize it soon enough by a little red spot which will become covered by a water blister. The blister will break open, leaving a raw spot on the skin.

The yellowish, watery-looking material that oozes from this spot dries and forms crusts that may pile up in thick layers.

When the blister breaks you have to be extremely careful to keep from spreading the disease over your own body and to other people. The oozing fluid from the blisters may be carried

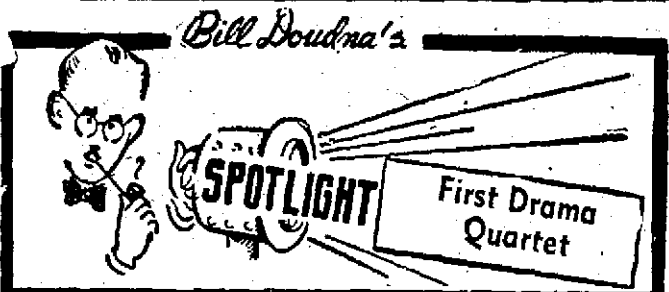
