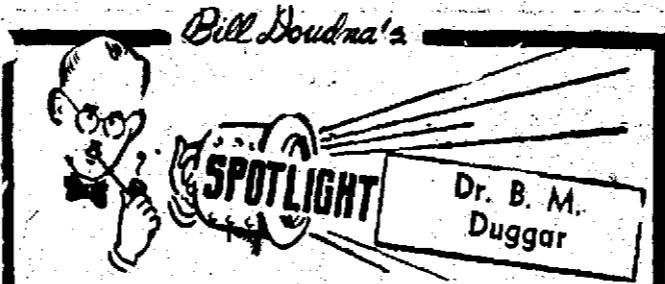

The story of Dr. Benjamin M. Duggar, University of Wisconsin scientist who discovered aureomycin after his retirement from the faculty, will be told to a nationwide audience Tuesday night. Walter Hampden will portray Dr. Duggar in a "Cavalcade of America" drama over NBC-WIBA at 7.

Dr. Duggar retired in 1943 at the age of 70 after 16 years' service at Wisconsin. But he did not retire from active scientific study. Instead, he began a new career as a research biologist at a laboratory in Pearl River, N. Y.

Aureomycin is used in the treatment of infections and diseases against which other new drugs have been ineffective. D. Duggar received his bachelor's and master's degrees at Harvard university, master of science at Alabama Polytechnic Institute, and doctor philosophy at Cornell university. He taught at Hadcliffe, Cornell, and the University of Missouri before coming to Wisconsin.

 WASHINGTON — (UP) — Federal mediators announced Thursday night an agreement between the Caterpillar Tractor Co. and the CIO United Auto Workers on a 13½-cent an hour wage hike for 22,000 workers who have been on strike for two months.

**GOP Could Win with Man Like Ike, Saltonstall Says**  
 NEW YORK — (UP) — Sen. Leverett Saltonstall (R-Mass.) said Thursday the Republican party can win the 1952 presidential election if they nominate "a leader like Gen. Eisenhower."  
 In an article in the American magazine, Saltonstall said that at the present time Eisenhower "appears to be the man most likely to be elected president of the United States."  
 "Although the polls went wrong in forecasting the election of Gov. Thomas E. Dewey in 1948, I still believe they are important in showing us trends in public opinion," he said.  
 "They now show that more of the people, including many Democrats in high places, prefer the general as their next president to anyone else yet mentioned."  
 The Massachusetts senator said he did not know whether Eisenhower would accept a draft, or whether he is a Democrat or Republican.  
 "However, I have read his speeches and I don't see how a man who has Gen. Eisenhower's firm belief in free enterprise and in the man who makes good through his own hard work, who has his hatred of political chicanery, ever could accept a Democrat nomination and become a partner of many of the Democratic city political bosses," he added.  
 Saltonstall warned that the GOP must disprove a charge that Republicans are sold and high-tail as well as tools of big business.  
 "We can win if we get off our platforms, get out of our cars, and make friends," Saltonstall said.  
 "We can win if we make the voters realize that the Republican party is looking into the future, not dreaming of the past, not attempting to restore the policies of the 1920s."
