British Tory Manifesto Asks Excess Profit Tax

London, Sept. 25.—(AP) Winston Churchill's Conservative party surprised the business community today by promising to tax excess profits by helping to pay for Britain's rearmament if the Conservatives win the Oct. 25 election. The party's election platform, known in this country as a manifesto, pledged to halt the nationalization of industry and to decentralize iron and steel. Signed by Churchill, the 2,000-word document accused the ruling Labor party of extravagance and maintained Labor's nationalization schemes have failed. Asks End of Socialism It called upon the British to free themselves of socialism to increase prosperity at home and rebuild the nation's prestige abroad. The election "may well be the turning point in the fortunes and even the life of Britain," Churchill wrote. On the subject of excess profits, he said: "We shall set our face against the fortuitous rise in company profits because of the abnormal process of rearmament. We shall accordingly impose a form of excess profits tax, to operate only during this exceptional period. "At the same time a revision of the existing system of taxation on commercial and industrial profits is required. Relief will be given in cases where profits are ploughed back and used for the renewal of plant and equipment. "Some Building Supported "Other main sections of the platform call for: 1—Simplification of administrative machinery and reduction of government expenditure. 2—Giving house building a priority second only to national defense, with the aim of getting 300,000 new houses a year. 3—Increasing national output. "First in the success of keeping our people fully employed, to halt the rising cost of living and to preserve our social services. 4—Retaining state control of the coal industry with a decentralized administration. 5—Reorganization of publicly-owned rail and road transport into regional groups of workable size. Private truckers will be given the chance to return to business. 6—May End Bulk Buying 6—Maintenance of the system of guaranteed agricultural prices and markets. The manifesto contained one statement which could foreshadow the end of much of Britain's present system of bulk buying: "To obtain more food, practical knowledge and business experience must be released to comb the world for greater supplies of raw materials. The Conservatives have maintained for some time that the labor government's bulk buying of meat from abroad has been a failure from Britain's point of view. Churchill dealt at length with international affairs. Backs Arms Program The platform promised support for the \$2,700,000,000 (\$1,169,000,000) three-year rearmament program started by the labor government, but maintained more a side in terms of actual defense could be gotten out of "the immense manpower and sums of money which are involved." Imperial preference in trade will be maintained. The Conservatives called on all parts of the British empire and commonwealth to "stand together and help each other with all our strength both in defense and trade." Continuation of close relationship with the United States is urged in this section: "There is the unity of English-speaking peoples who together number hundreds of millions. They have only to act in harmony to preserve their own freedom and the general peace." The Conservatives promised to work for a united Europe, "including in the course of time those unhappy countries still behind the iron curtain."
