Agamemnon was the king of Argos, and was looked upon as the most powerful ruler in Greece. He played the leading part in getting together the Greeks who attacked the Trojans...

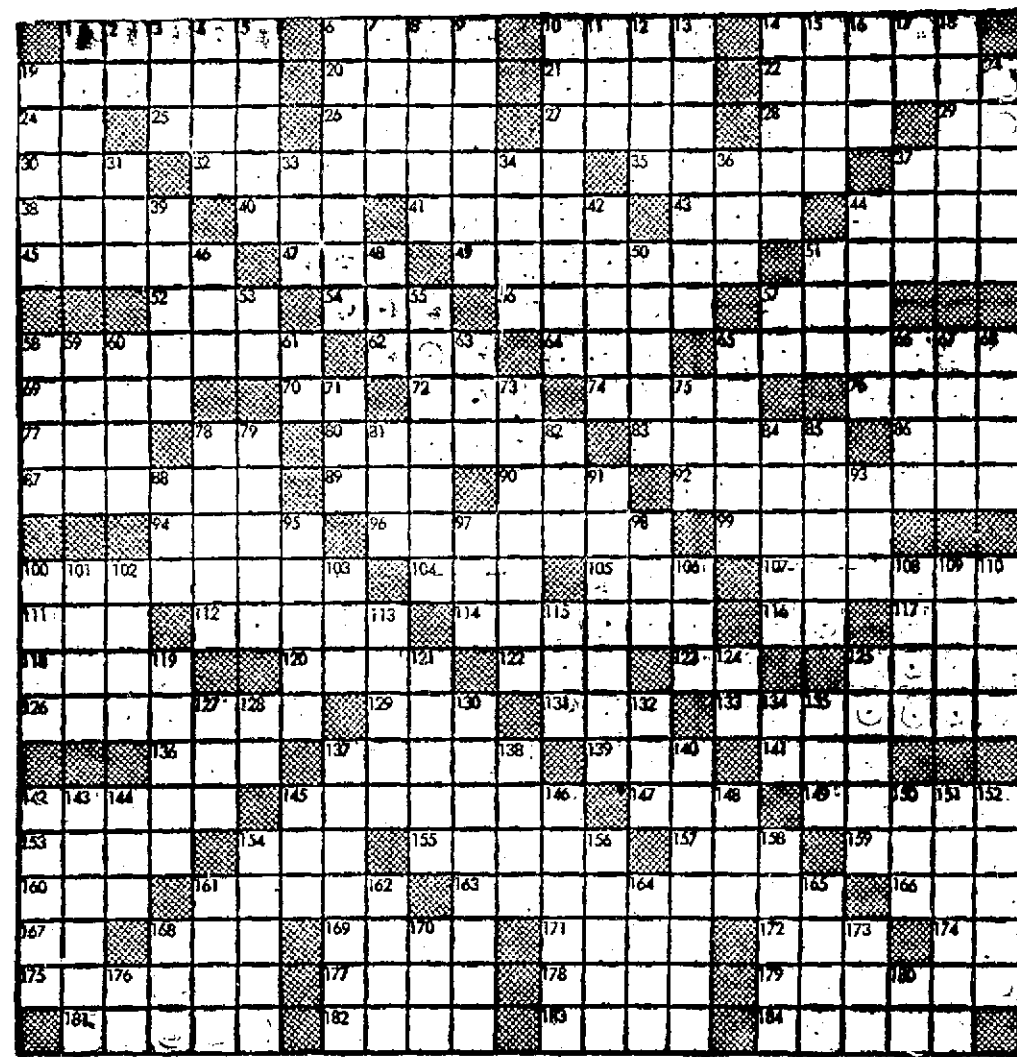
single combat the boldest of the Greeks. King Menelaus offered to oppose him, and a fierce fight took place.
