Cab Rider Awarded \$1,900 in Damage Suit

Mrs. Isabel Lee Haack, 412 West Shore dr., was awarded \$1,900 Wednesday afternoon in circuit court in settlement of her \$10,000 damage suit involving leg injuries she received while riding as a passenger in a taxi owned by the City Car Co., 531 State st.

Mrs. Haack was riding in a City cab on Dec. 31, 1948, when it was involved in an accident at Milton and Murray sts., with a car driven by Joseph C. Thomas, a Madison car mechanic.

According to the settlement approved by Circuit Judge Herman W. Sachtjen, Mrs. Haack will receive \$1,900, half to be paid by the City Car Co. and the other half by Thomas' insurers, the Accident and Casualty Insurance Co.
