KTSL to Increase Power Greatly in Change Oct. 28

Channel 2, CBS's television network station in Los Angeles, will move its transmitter to Mt. Wilson on Sunday, Oct. 28. The move to Mt. Wilson will enable KNXT to offer the public a tenfold increase in power, as well as a picture which CBS-KNXT Engineer Herbert W. Pangborn conservatively says will be "second to none." KNXT will increase its effective visual power from 9300 watts to 25,000 watts, or from 2.56 kw. to 25 kw., effective radiated power, practically a tenfold increase. Aural power will be increased commensurately. The height of the KNXT antenna above the average terrain is to be increased from 980 to 2837 feet. The antenna will be located 5831 feet above sea level.

"The Columbia Broadcasting System assumed ownership and operation of the nation's first television station on Jan. 1, 1951," Edwards stated, "and applied to the FCC soon thereafter for permission to move its transmitter to Mt. Wilson in order to give the public clearer and stronger pictures. Permission was granted on Aug. 24 and work plans were begun the very next day to effect the switch."

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 13. (AP) Pierre Monteux, 76-year-old conductor, is leaving the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra next May after 17 seasons. The short, mustached Frenchman, who has won international acclaim and raised the San Francisco Orchestra to national fame, is not retiring. He will conduct at Cincinnati's musical festival in May and at the Berlin festival next September. Between the two dates he will tour South America as a guest conductor.

Quarantine Posts Eye 7 Million During 1950. SACRAMENTO, Oct. 13. (AP) More than 7,000,000 persons passed through quarantine stations of the State Department of Agriculture during 1950, according to A. A. Brock, director. A total of 2,364,691 automobiles, 226,831 commercial trucks and 39,056 station wagons, by the state's 18 stations, situated up and down California's borders. Of the automobiles, 1,434,430 were from out of state; of the 7,094,893 passengers in the autos, stages and trucks, 3,024,657 were out-of-staters.
