TIP OF THE MORNING:
Mario Lanza is about to sign a "fantastic" new recording deal, unlike any ever made, says Correspondent Edith Gwynn in a note from Hollywood. No details available yet.

ART SHOWS: Pictures by Wisconsin grade school children make up for unique art shows now touring Wisconsin, California, and South Dakota. They were arranged from work done by radio pupils of Prof. James A. Schwabach, who conducts "Let's Draw" on the Wisconsin School of the Air over WHA and the state radio council's network.

Schwabach, who has been teaching art for 15 years to pupils who can't see him, gathered the pictures and sent them out with sample radio scripts, a tape recording of a typical broadcast, and a discussion of the program's aims.

"These exhibits are being sent out," he said, "to show teachers and administrators in schools, and parents working toward the teaching profession, how the grade school curriculum can be augmented by radio teaching.

Two of the shows are in Wisconsin. The first was at Union Grove Oct. 3-7, the second at Plattville Oct. 3-7. The remainder of their itineraries:

GURDJIEFF: A rarely seen art form, the sacred temple dance of the East, developed by the late Georges Gurdjieff, will be shown in Madison at 8 p. m. Tuesday, Oct. 30, by members of the Taliesin fellowship.

The program will be at the First Unitarian meeting house, 900 University Bay dr. Tickets may be obtained by mail or at the University co-op book department.

Performance of the Gurdjieff movements will also mark a demonstration of the secular side of the Unitarian church, with a turnout of the auditorium seats toward an improvised stage.

The Gurdjieff movements will be under direction of Iovanna Lloyd Wright, daughter of architect Frank Lloyd Wright, who studied under Gurdjieff in Paris for several months before his death two years ago.

"These exercises," she says, "are concerned with the development of the inner faculties of man. Based on definite knowledge of rhythm, they develop a succession of movements intended to intensify the correlation of the individual and his power of attention so much needed in our life today.

"As art they are derived by Georges Gurdjieff from the sacred temple ceremonies of the East. They are original, however, in that their author discovered only their origin during his search for knowledge in monasteries and esoteric schools in Tibet, Turkestan, Afghanistan, Kafiristan, and Ceylon. He has adapted them to the practices which you will see in this performance.

"The Gurdjieff music they typify was composed by Georges Gurdjieff himself."

Senate Overrides Veto on Cars for Disabled Veterans

WASHINGTON—AP—The senate voted 55 to 40 Friday to override Pres. Truman's veto of a bill which would have the government pay up to \$1,600 on the price of an automobile for any veteran of World War II, or the Korean War, who has lost a leg or an arm, or is blind or nearly so.
