Mutual Radio Will Offer New Shows From MGM

HOLLYWOOD. (AP) The Mutual radio network, seeking to bolster its program structure, is making preparations to introduce five new programs and plans five others to be added later.

These are the shows developed by the radio department of the movie company, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, also owner of a New York City station, WMGM. They are covered in an arrangement recently concluded by the network.

As scheduled, the first programs are to start the week of Nov. 19. They have been previewed in closed circuit presentations to the affiliates, whose acceptance of the shows is a factor in the deal.

Full consummation of the arrangement, radio men point out, will result in the closest association yet between the movies and network radio.

Four of the programs, each a half-hour, are to be carried Monday through Friday in the 8 to 9 hour, displacing items now on the air. The fifth, an hour-long drama, is for Saturday nights. All have become established as radio features on a local station basis. They are to originate from Hollywood and for the most part use MGM stars.

The Saturday night presentation is "Theater of the Air," which MBS plans to insert at 8:30. The week night programs, drama except for the Gracie Fields variety show, are "Crime Does Not Pay," "Dr. Kildare," and "The Hardy Family," the last two having originated in the movies. The other five programs, yet to be announced, are to be new features.

Both sides hope to benefit considerably from the deal, which has been under consideration since last spring. In addition to getting new shows, the network and its affiliates expect to gain new sponsor income. That, in turn, will be of advantage to MGM, which will obtain a much wider audience for its programs than has been possible under the local station distribution by means of recordings.
