TIP OF THE MORNING: Radio Row is betting—and hoping—that Mrs. India Edwards will succeed William Boyle as chairman of the Democratic national committee . . . hoping, because she's convinced radio and television are the most important media in a campaign.

Although the radio season is well started, new shows are still coming and old ones are returning.

For example: "U. N.—On the Record," the show which gave Yakov Malik his sounding-board for the speech that started the Korean armistice talks, returns at 5:15 p. m. Saturday to CBS. "The Green Hornet," dramatic series, returns to the air via Mutual at 5 p. m. Wednesdays and Fridays starting Nov. 7. The Oklahoma City Symphony orchestra begins its third season on Mutual at 9 a. m. Sunday. "Light and Life Hour," new religious series, starts at 8:30 p. m. Sunday on ABC. "The Falcon," starring Les Damon, returns to NBC at 3 p. m. Sunday. Leon Pearson starts a 15-minute show, "Critic at Large," on NBC at noon Sunday. Jane Ace, former co-star of "Easy Aces," returns the air via NBC as a disc jockey at 9:30 p. m. Saturday. The "Somerset Maugham Theater" comes back, this time on NBC, at 10 a. m. Saturdays starting this week.

FARM AWARD: Watford G. Seguin, farmer at Eleva, Wis., will receive an agricultural award during the Alex Dreier-Lloyd Burlingham program over WIBA at 7 a. m. Saturday.

COMPETITION: "Playhouse on Broadway," heard on NBC-WIBA at 9:30 p. m. Tuesdays, next week will launch a college acting competition. A talented performer from some American college or university will be heard each week in a featured role opposite a stage or screen star.

Natalie Craveth, a senior at New York university, will be heard with Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., in "A Star is Born" in the Oct. 30 broadcast. Mary Finney of Fordham university will participate in the Nov. 6 program with Richard Greene in "The Shop around the Corner." On Nov. 13, Forrest Compton of Yale university will be heard with Linda Darnell in "I'll Be Seeing You."

This new plan has been approved by the American National Theater and Academy (ANTA). The neophytes making their debuts will be recommended by campus drama department heads and screened and auditioned there. Each participant, in addition to travel expenses to the point of origin of the "Playhouse," will receive a \$250 plus the initiation fee of the American Federation of Radio Artists. An ANTA board of judges will pass upon performances and, at the end of a cycle, will select top performers for the grand finale. This winner will receive a substantial cash award and a contract for future guest appearances on network radio.

Charles Martin is the producer-director-host-writer of this program. Noted for his building of repertory acting groups, he has also been a star-finder and star-maker.

FILM FARE: Edith Gwynn, paired with Don Ray, turned out such hits as the incomparable "I'll Remember April," "Mr. Five by Five," and many more. "Gypsy Blood," the movie that started Jennifer Jones and was finished in England over a year ago, will finally be released in America around Christmas time. Meantime, Wald-Krassnauer haven't given up hope of getting Jennifer as the top star in their hard-to-cast "Exclusive Model" or as the femme star of "Strike a Match"—or for both. The lady has the two scripts she needs in the okay of her lord and master, D. O. Selznick.
