KTSL Will Become KNXT, Move Its Tower Sunday

Channel 2, CBS' Television Network station in Los Angeles, will move its transmitter to Mt. Wilson Sunday.

The move to Mt. Wilson will enable KNXT to offer the public a tenfold increase in power, as well as a picture which Engineer Herbert W. Pangborn says will be "second to none."

The height of the KNXT antenna above the average terrain is to be increased from 980 feet to 2857 feet.

Within the next few years, the majority of new television stations will be on UHF channels.

Both government and the broadcasting industry are anxious to get one thing over to the general public: "Don't let the introduction of UHF into television scare you."

The mixing of UHF and VHF broadcasting will not make present sets obsolete.

About 12,000,000 of the 14,000,000 TV sets now in use this year were made before UHF channel reception.
