Football on the Air

TIP OF THE MORNING: You can expect a new radio-dramatic series starring Marlene Dietrich.

The Wisconsin-Northwestern and Purdue-Notre Dame games will hold the football spotlight on the air Saturday. The Badger-Wildcat battle will be WIBA, WIBA-FM, WFOV, WLS, WBU, and WWCF at 1:45 p. m.; on WISC, WISC-FM, and WIND at 1:55, and on WJJD at 2. The Boiler-maker-Irish game will be on WGN at 1:15 p. m., on WBBM at 1:25 p. m., and on WMAQ at 1:50 p. m. If your radio brings in WCCO, you can hear the Minnesota-Michigan tussle at 1:30 p. m.

At the Shows

Capitol
FEATURE: A Streetcar Named Desire.
TYPE: Adult drama.
CAST: Stan, Marlon Brando; Blanche, Vivien Leigh; Stella, Kim Hunter; Mitch, Karl Malden.
REVIEWER: Wally Wikoff.
STORY: This somewhat altered and purified version of the prize-winning play again recounts the upset created by the arrival of fading Blanche at the New Orleans hotel of her sister, Stella, and Stella's husband, Stan... From the start Stan, an animalistic brute with a high conception of his authority in the house, dislikes the affected Blanche whose past is fogged by fabrications... Groping for a final chance at security, Blanche tries to lure Stan's poker-playing pal, Mitch, into marriage, but Stan's abuse drives her to insanity.
HIGH POINTS: The three extremely difficult roles of Stan, Blanche, and Stella were nobly done... the strain and turmoil so realistic that you welcome the chance to relax after it's all over.
LOW POINTS: Some instances of over-dramatization even for Blanche who is supposed to be dramatic.
VERDICT: Excellent treatment of Tennessee Williams' play; not recommended for children or the naive.
