Berman, Freibert, Meckalski, Pisarek, and Solie are University of Wisconsin graduates.  
Works of Wilde, O'Connell, Freibert, and Schwartz received special commendation from the jury, the equivalent of awards, since no prizes were given.

## Truax Field's New Band Makes Debut

Truax Field's new band—the 504th air force band—which arrived in Madison only last week, made its first public appearance here Wednesday.

The band members came from more than 25 universities, colleges, and conservatories. Fleig, who attended the University of Cincinnati and Cincinnati Conservatory of Music and worked with the Dayton Symphony orchestra before enlisting in 1941, has served in military bands in North Africa, Sicily, Italy, France and Germany and played with the air force band in Washington, D. C.

For most of the Madison area, the first opportunity to hear the band will come at 6 p. m. Saturday, when its dance unit, the Airmen of Melody, plays the first of a series of broadcasts over WIBA at 6 p. m. The dance band is led by Corp. Walter Levinsky, a former member of Tommy Dorsey's orchestra.

The 40-member 504th air force band came here from headquarters of the air force defense command at Ent air force base in Colorado Springs, Colo., where it had been stationed eight months.

While in Colorado it played at the Colorado State fair, at the opening of the air forces finance center in Denver, and at the National All-Service rodeo at Colorado Springs.

The band includes several special units that do everything from weekly radio show to stage shows to military marching.

The concert band is directed by Warrant Officer Harry Fleig. It plays and marches in parades, plays concerts, and does broadcast.

The dance band has a regular program in Colorado Springs. The Airmen of Harmony, a comparatively new unit, is a glee club. The band also includes a rhythm
