Near East Border Disputes Persist

PARIS, Nov. 10. (AP) Lt. Gen. William E. Riley, United Nations truce supervisor in Palestine, reported today he had been unable to end the dispute between Israel and Syria over control of the demilitarized border zone. In another report he said Israel and Egypt still were at loggerheads over claims and counter-claims of truce violations in the Gaza area, near the Sinai Peninsula.

Oil Experts Advise Big-Scale Storage

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10. (AP) The council, in its newly completed report, said that salt formations offer the greatest possibilities for use because artificial caverns can be made in such formations by pumping in fresh water and drawing off the brine. The report contained maps showing vast underground salt beds in northwestern Texas, east-central New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas, Michigan, northeastern Ohio, northern West Virginia, western Pennsylvania and southwestern New York, and Salt Domes in Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama.

Mrs. Roosevelt Will Sell Late President's Relics

NEW YORK, Nov. 10. (AP) Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt today offered for sale 1450 items from the personal collection of the late President and his family. Fifty cents will purchase one of four tiny liqueur glasses used by President Roosevelt. An early American cherry wood desk, dating from around 1700, has been priced at \$1200.

Oil Firm Wins Suit on Gasoline

Superior Court Judge Vernon W. Hunt has granted a judgment in favor of Seaside Oil Co. in a suit filed against the company by Lloyd Bartlett, local service station operator. Effect of the judge's decision was to hold that Bartlett had shown no facts in his pleadings which would justify trial of his charge that he had been delivered inferior gasoline.

Woman Hears Bookie Charges

She was held to answer to the Superior Court on six felony counts of bookmaking and her arraignment in Superior Court was set for Nov. 26.

British Families Evacuating Egypt

CAIRO, Egypt, Nov. 10. (AP) An RAF spokesman at British headquarters in Fayid announced that three four-engineered troop carrier planes today began evacuation of RAF families to Britain. The four planes will run a shuttle service between the Canal Zone and Britain until the emergency evacuation program is completed.

Probation, \$25 Fine for Beating Children

Christensen admitted beating his two daughters, ages 7 and 6, on Oct. 10, and his son, 8, on Oct. 11.

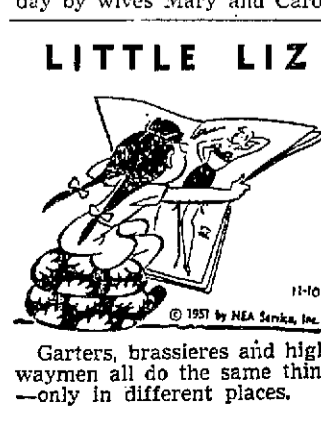
