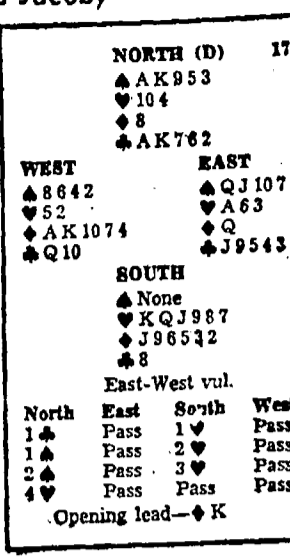

KANSAS CITY, Mo.—(UP)—Sen. Robert A. Taft said Friday the threat we face from Soviet Russia "may go on forever" and the United States must learn to live with that menace "within its means."
Taft, at present the only avowed candidate for the Republican presidential nomination, attacked administration spending "for spending's sake," branded "Pendergastism" in Washington, and said the administration is attempting "to give us Great Britain's Socialism."
