There's usually more than one way to make a bridge hand, just as there's usually more than one way o kill a cat.

In today's hand, sharp defense robbed declarer of the simple play for his contract, but he was clever enough to find a satifactory substitute.

West opened the king of diamonds and realized the situation when his partner dropped the

West thoughtfully shifted to a trump, the best defense. East naturally took the ace of trumps and led a second round of

trumps, thus killing dummy's ruf-

ling power. The contract would have been easy against any other defense. South was sure of five trumps in his own hand and four top cards in the dummy. If he could ruff a diamond with dummy's 10, the 10th trick would surely develop.

If East over-ruffed, the South hand would win six trump tricks; if East failed to over-ruff, dummy's trump would win a trick. Declarer won the second round

of trumps with dummy's ten, cashed the top spades, and ruffed Next he drew the last trump with

the king of hearts and entered dummy with a club to lead another low spade. East played the queen of spades and South calmly discarded a dia-

mond. mond.

Now dummy's nine of spades was high as declarer's much-needed loth trick.

What's more, East had to lead a

club (he had nothing but clubs left) to dummy's ace, thus enabling dummy to gain the lead.

U. S. Must Learn to Live with Russ Threat, Taft Says

KANSAS CITY, Mo.—(U.A).—Sen. Robert A. Tait said Friday the threat we face from Soviet Russia "may go on forever" and the United States must learn to live with that menace "within its means." Taft, at present the only avowed candidate for the Republican presi-

dential nomination, attacked ad-ministration spending "for spend-ing's sake," branded "Pendergast-ism" in Washington, and said the administration is attempting "t give us Great Britain's Socialism. The Ohioan spread his remarks through a series of whirlwind speeches, press conferences, and receptions as many Kansas City Republicans warmed to his cam-paign and broke out Taft buttons

for the first time.

Taft said at a luncheon before some 450 guests of the Kansas City real estate board that he did not wish in the least to discount the danger we face from Soviet Russia.

"But our defense program poses serious problems in economy... and spending, if maintained at the current rate, will amount to \$85,000,000,000 in fiscal 1953," Taft

"We do not know yet what that will mean, but I believe it will bring us to the brink of inflation." Friday in Pres. Truman's home-town he occupied the presidential penthouse suite at the Hotel Much-lebach and attacked "Pendergast-ism," which he said had spread to Washington "condoning every type of crime." of crime."
