HOLLYWOOD—Betty White's dimples are her stock in trade and seeing is believing. Give a look any afternoon Monday through Friday between 1:30 and 5:30 p. m., or on Saturday at 9:30 p. m. during the Al Jarvis show over KTLA (13) and see if you don't agree. Here is real refreshing beauty in a girl, free from the usual Hollywood affectations, which reflects her wholesome home life with Mother and Father White. (This ought to keep those wolves away. See—she brings out the protective instinct even in a hardened columnist—Oh, those dimples!) Betty, who is 26 years old, was born in Oak Park, Ill., moving to California at the age of 2. She attended Beverly Hills High School, but after graduation, the radio bug got the best of her, particularly the "closed shop" attitude with those in the business toward outsiders. Betty consented this challenge and after many interviews, started her career in radio with but one line of a commercial on the Hal Peary ("Great Gildersleeve") show. For this "great" part, she had to join the artists' union—dues for which were twice as much as her pay. When Betty told her father about this great opportunity, his only comment was: "If you don't work too often, we can almost afford it!"

Bishop Expects 'No' on Vatican Envoy

HOLLYWOOD, Nov. 19. (AP) Methodists Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam predicts the Senate will refuse to confirm the appointment of an ambassador to the Vatican. Oxnam, president of the World Council of Churches, addressed a Methodist rally in Hollywood Bowl last night. "The real issue," said Oxnam, "is clericalism—the pursuit of power, especially political power, by a religious hierarchy, carried on by secular methods, for purposes of social domination." "It is impossible to distinguish between Pacelli, the prelate, and Pacelli, the politician." He apparently referred to Pope Pius XII, formerly cardinal Eugenio Pacelli.

Fatal Hotel Blaze Faces Investigations

CHICAGO, Nov. 19. (AP) Two investigations were planned today into a southside hotel fire which claimed three lives, injured nine others and left many homeless. Some occupants of the Norwood Hotel, leaped from windows and others were brought down ladders by firemen battling the blaze in freezing weather. Five persons who jumped from the top floor to a concrete sidewalk were injured seriously. Earl Downes, assistant corporation counsel, and Coroner A. L. Brodie ordered separate investigations into the fire on reports that there had been a delay in reporting the blaze.

Japanese Freighter Sinks in Mid-Pacific

TOKYO, Nov. 19. (AP) The 8663-ton Japanese freighter Kinugasa Maru, in trouble 10 days and abandoned by its crew, today sank in the mid-Pacific. Maritime safety headquarters announced a report of the sinking was received by the patrol boat Daio, which had been standing by the derelict 1000 miles east of Japan.

De Gasperi Launches Sixth FAO Meeting

ROME, Nov. 19. (AP) Italian Premier Alcide De Gasperi opened the sixth world conference of the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization today, dedicating it to the creation of men "free from want and thus free from the passions of hate." FAO this is one of the most powerful instruments in the world today for peace, De Gasperi declared. The flags of 65 nations flew overhead as the three-week-long session opened. The star of communism was on only one of them—the flag of anti-Communism Yugoslavia.

(AP) Mr. and Mrs. Winston Churchill today moved into the furnished apartment on the third floor of No. 10 Downing Street—official residence of Britain's prime minister. The apartment was redecorated after the defeated premier, Clement Attlee, and Mrs. Attlee moved out, four days after the national election, Oct. 25.

Britons Slay 1754 Diseased Animals LONDON, Nov. 19. (AP) A serious outbreak of foot and mouth disease in eastern England has forced the slaughter of 1754 farm animals in five days. The movement of livestock has been banned in parts of 13 English counties. Eighteen outbreaks have been reported in the area since Wednesday. Diseased animals killed include 742 cattle, 566 sheep and 446 pigs, the ministry of agriculture reported today.
