Faye Emerson, who has been given the word that Dinah Shore plans to put showmanship, not bosoms, into her new television show, and has come out with a complete lack of V in the neckline and a brand new hair-do. At any rate, Dinah, who at home prefers to be called Mrs. Montgomery, will not wear decollete clothing in her new TV'er. Instead, Dinah wants to come into the TVviewer's home at 7:30 in the evening with good songs and music, singing directly to you from NBC-TV Tuesdays. This also will be seen on Thursdays of each week and locally on KNBH (Channel 4).

Dinah is noted in music circles for her remarkable gift for selecting songs with "hit" potentialities. The lady of song first exhibited this talent early in her professional career. She auditioned a new tune, entitled "Blues in the Night" Her musical adviser, Tucker Freeman, was dubious. It would never be a hit, he argued. But against his judgment, Dinah went ahead and recorded the blues number.

The rest is history. The song was a tremendous success and established Dinah as one of the top recording stars of the country. She is the first "filly" from NBC's Hollywood stable to go transcontinental with her own show.

SANTA ANA. Three Orange County 4-H members, Roy Rose, Nancy Bascom and Alice Ann Adams will take part in a special edition of the National Farm and Home Hour televised in Chicago, Ill., from the International Livestock Exposition on Tuesday, 12 to 1 p. m. (P. S. T.) over station KNBH—Channel 4, Los Angeles. Selection of the grand champion steer of the International Livestock Exposition will be the main event of the show and will be telecast direct from the arena in Chicago, says H. W. Longfellow, farm adviser. A full hour of television, starting at 12 p. m. (P.S.T.) will cover the most interesting features of this world-famous exposition. In addition to picking the grand champion, viewers will watch judging of the carlot champions, meat cutting demonstration, interviews with delegates to the National 4-H Club Congress, and other high lights of the day. This year, for the first time, the show will be telecast coast-to-coast. It will mark the first time that an agricultural event can be viewed all across the country. There is always keen competition among top exhibitors at the International because important prize money is involved as well as the world champion title. Steers shown by boys and girls have won the grand championship over adult competition 11 times in the past 23 years. Thousands of people who have never visited the International Livestock Exposition will have a ringside seat this year because of television.
