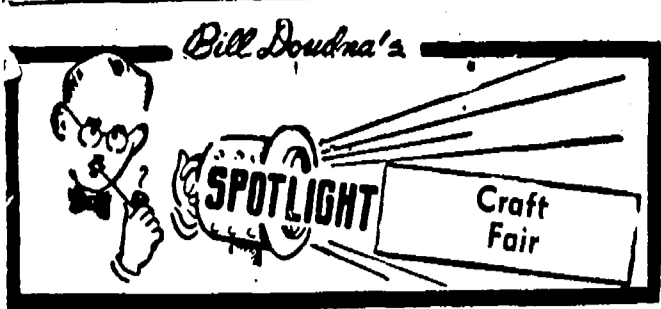

2-Hour Parking Zone on East Side Proposed

A 2-hour parking zone in the 1400 block on E. Washington ave., between the North Western railroad tracks and Thornton ave., was requested in a letter received by Mayor George Forster Tuesday from Gilman F. Albrecht, president of the Dairy Equipment Co. The letter will be referred to the city council Thursday night. His company, the Home Insulation Co. and Pure Oil Co., which occupy all the street frontage on the south side of the 1400 block, Albrecht said, have provided parking spaces for all their employees at the rear of their buildings to leave the frontage free for customers. But from 7 a. m. on daily, employees of the Red Dot Foods Co. and Ohio Chemical Co. occupy all the street spaces, leaving no room for customers and "driving business away," he complained.
