Survey Group Calls for 'Streamlining' of Methodist Church

CHICAGO (UP)—A special survey commission Wednesday night issued a report which called for "streamlining" the superstructure of the Methodist church. Leaders said the plan will be presented to the church's general conference in San Francisco next Apr. 23 and may become the biggest issue since Methodist unification in 1939.

A streamlining program drawn up by the commission represented three years of work since the study was authorized by the 1948 general conference. It called for establishing a new board of social and economic relations; reducing the number of general agencies by 50 per cent; setting up a new, top-level coordinating council; cutting membership of general boards and agencies by 20 per cent, and trimming the amount of promotional material and periodicals. The proposed board of social and economic relations would be put on an equal footing with the church's present board of temperance and commission on world peace, and would be charged with providing information and guidance on social and economic questions. The coordinating council would be a top-level group of 32 mem-
