"A few nights later, Marjorie's Aunt Sandra went to the Roose wilt Grill and told Guy Lembardo the tale of her 9-year-old niece's song having won on 'Songs for Sale.' Lombardo asked her to demonsecate it, which she did from the Grill's bandstand. Twice more during theevening Lombardo had her play the song, each time noting an enthusiastic public response.

Before the night was over, Lombardo had acquired publishing rights to the tune, and had phoned Milt Rackmil, president of Decca Records, who was in California, telling him he wanted to wax the tune at once. "On Friday, Nov. 23, Lombardo and Evelyn Knight recorded it,

and so pleasing were the results that Decca ordered an unprecedented 200,000 first pressing. The song, a waitz, contains no words of more than two syllables,
