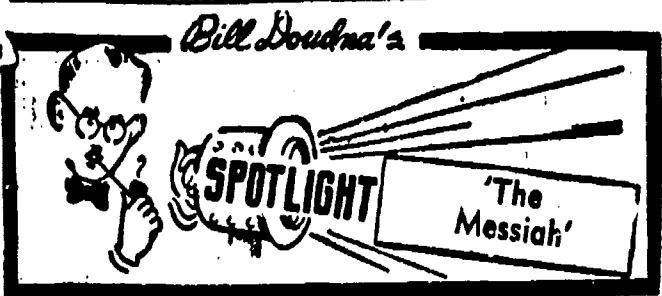


Give to the Empty Stocking Club
