



TIP O' THE MORNING: Tyrone Power will replace Cornel Wilde as star of 'Cavalcade of America' Tuesday at 7 p.m. (NBC-WIBA).

FOR 90 MINUTES or so Sunday afternoon, 200 University of Wisconsin students helped Madison to remember the calm and peace and personal joy of Christmas, and to forget the bustle of buying.

With organ, harp, and brass accompaniment, the students voices sang of Christ's birth, of angels' hallelujahs, of shepherds' jubilee, of wise men's gifts. They recalled in song the yuletide legends of many lands and many centuries, many of them half-forgotten today.

Four choirs sang from three balconies of Luther Memorial church—the University chorus in one, the a cappella choir in another, and the men's and women's choruses in the third. Directing them were Profs. Helen Blotz and Paul Jones and Graduate Assistant Donn Weiss.

There was a spirit of giving and a feeling of unanimity in the singing, whether a single voice was heard or all the 200. Echo effects in 'While by My Sheep'—sung by the combined choirs—were startlingly real, and the acoustics of the auditorium proved to be as near perfect as one could hope for when the choirs united, yet permitting each to be heard well everywhere when only one sang.

An audience of 1,800 heard the concert, and other persons were turned away for lack of room. Some day, perhaps, we will have an auditorium capable of handling all who want to hear; it certainly was needed Sunday.

BAND CONCERT: The Catholic All-City Cadet band, the Catholic All-City band, and the Edgewood high school band will unite their talents at 8 p.m. Tuesday to present a Christmas concert in the Edgewood high school auditorium.

Don R. Marcouiller directs the Edgewood and cadet bands, and Roger S. Mazzy directs the all-city group. The high school organization has 64 members; the cadet band is made up of 45 beginning musicians, and the all-city aggregation has 55 advanced grade-school players.

One of the features of the concert will be a cornet radio trio, made up of Michael Hayes, Paul Haack, and James Shunk, playing Walters' 'Fantasy for Three'.

The program: Cadet band—"Jolly Old Nick," "Diligence March," "Grandfather's Clock" (saxophone solo by Patricia Ball), and "Jingle Bells." All-city band—"Down the Field" march, "Babs" overture, "Novellette" (saxophone solo by Mary Ann Joyce), "Too Young," and "Santa Claus Is Coming to Town."

Edgewood band—"Bach Bouquet," "Pavanne" (Gould), "The Afternoon of a Faun," "Christmas Rhapsody," and "Promenade." Tickets are being sold by band members and will be available at the door.

CHORAL CONCERT: The Madison Scottish Rite chorus will give a concert for patients at the Madison Veterans hospital at 8:45 p.m. Wednesday. Robert L. Tottingham will direct the chorus, with Jerry Blake as accompanist.

The group will sing in the hospital lounge, and the music will be carried to the patients by public-address system. Wives and other relatives will be welcome to hear the program in the lounge.
