Bob Hope Show for Vets Aired on KFI Tonight at 9

L. A. Labor Asks Housing Inquiry

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 25. (UP) Organized labor in Los Angeles joined their legions today in demanding federal investigation to determine whether there is unlawful conspiracy and collusion aimed at wrecking the public housing program. The Central Council of the AFL and CIO bluntly called for federal inquiry into charges that some city councilmen and several pressure organizations are parties to such a conspiracy. They made the demand in a telegram to acting U. S. Attorney Walter S. Binns. The telegram was signed by W. J. Bassett, secretary of the Los Angeles AFL Central Labor Council, and Albert T. Luneford, secretary-treasurer of the Greater Los Angeles CIO Council. "They ought to be expected to investigate," Binns said, "charges that individuals and organizations representing property owners are conspiring and colluding unlawfully to defeat the purposes of the U. S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended." It is under this statute that the City Housing Authority set up plans for the \$110,000,000 low rent, slum clearance housing program which the City Council now is seeking to revoke.

Fire-Damaged Seiner Checked

The purse seiner El Padre which Pacific Towboat & Salvage Co. towed into port after she was nearly destroyed in a fire in the Catalina Channel last Saturday is undergoing survey at Harbor Boat Building Co. yard, Terminal Island. El Padre a year ago sank in deep water six miles southeast of Point Dume, at which time the crew was picked up by another fishing vessel. She was then skippered by Vincent Flamenco, San Pedro. When she took fire Saturday she was under command of John Ruzich. Pacific Towboat Co. spokesmen said they arrived at the side of the burned ship Saturday barely in time to save the hull, which virtually had been pumped full of water by Coast Guard vessels. Ruzich and his crew were landed safely at San Pedro.

Brother Slain Christmas Eve

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25. (AP) While his children slept through the night before Christmas William Van Nort was killed by his brother at the foot of their gift-laden Christmas tree, police said today. A Montgomery County, Md., detective captain, G. W. Linticum, said that the shooting occurred 15 minutes before midnight in the Van Nort living room. The home is at Cabin John, Md., five miles northwest of here on the banks of the Potomac River. Van Nort, 42, died instantly. Coroner F. X. Eroschart said, of a single blast from a 12-gauge shotgun, fired at point-blank range. His brother, Clarence Van Nort, 62, was arrested, charged with murder.

Bus Strike Ends on Atlantic Coast

RALEIGH, N. C., Dec. 25. (AP) With the drivers' strike ended, Carolina Greyhound buses were carrying their cargoes of Christmas passengers today. The strike ended yesterday at 4 p. m. And hour and a half later the first of the company's 235 strike-bound carriers was under way on schedule. The strike, which went into effect at 12:01 last Saturday morning, affected holiday travel in eastern North Carolina and eastern Virginia. The 260 drivers had asked for a flat pay rate of 7.5 cents a mile. The company had offered to raise feeder line rates from 5.30 cents a mile to 4.64, and main line rates from 6 cents a mile to 6.32 before the drivers struck.

SANTA CITED Reindeer Driver in Motor Trouble

DENVER, Dec. 25. (AP) Santa Claus came through all right last night, but for a while it looked like he might be sidetracked into the Denver jail. It was an automobile, not a sleigh, that almost proved the jolly gen's undoing. A Denver resident reported to police that a car hit her parked car and dented the left side. Patrolman Harry Taylor went to work and tracked the case to a Santa at work in a store. The Santa, John T. Heaney, a neighbor of the complaining woman, said that he knew he hit something when he backed out of his driveway, but thought it was the curb. The patrolman gave Santa a ticket for improper parking and left without further questioning. Taylor said he couldn't ask for Heaney's driver's license or question him extensively in front of all those kids.

Solons Probe Mine Disaster

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25. (AP) The Senate labor-management subcommittee called today for a report on causes of the disastrous West Frankfort, Ill., coal mine explosion Friday which cost the lives of 119 miners. Sen. Humphrey (D-Minn.), who heads the subcommittee, said his group would examine reports from the Interior Department, Bureau of Mines and Labor Department to determine whether the disaster signaled a need for tighter safety laws. Congress has never passed a compulsory mine safety law. The federal government provides an inspection service, but recommendations are not enforceable.
