Warren, Douglas Lead Union Poll

Chiefs Take Vote on Truman Successor
WASHINGTON (UP)—Union leaders turned thumbs down Wednesday on Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower as a Republican presidential candidate and said that Gov. Earl Warren of California is the GOP's best bet.

were Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) and Eisenhower whose name appeared on both the Republican and Democratic tickets.
Not a single union official voted for Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-O.) co-author of the Taft-Hartley labor-management law, or former Minnesota Gov. Harold E. Stassen. Taft and Warren are the only avowed Republican candidates. Stassen will announce today whether he will run.

The poll was conducted by the Machinists, weekly publication of the AFL International Association of Machinists, among 150 presidents of the AFL CIO, railroad brotherhood, and independent unions.
40% Reply
The officials were asked to name the man whom they thought would draw the greatest labor support on the Republican ticket and on the Democratic ticket in the event Mr. Truman decides not to seek reelection. The Machinists said "more than 40 per cent" replied.

Warren, on the GOP slate, received 74 per cent of the votes, followed by Eisenhower with 14. Among those with one or more votes in the GOP poll were Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York, Gen. Douglas MacArthur, Sen. James H. Duff (Pa.), Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. (Mass.), and Sen. Wayne Morse (Ore.).
Douglas led the Democratic nominee with 47 per cent of the votes.
