WASHINGTON — (UP) — Union leaders turned thumbs down Wednesday on Gen. Dwight Disenhower as a Republican presidential candidate and said that Gov. Earl Warren of California is the GOP's best bet.

Manuel appeared on Both the Republican the Republican and Democratic tickets.

Not a single union official voted for Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-O.). Co-author of the Taft-Hartley labor-management law, or former Minnesota Gov. Harold E. Stassen. Taft and Warren are the only avowed Republican candidates. Stassen will announce today whether he will run.

The poll was conducted by the Wachinists, weekly publication of Machinists, weekly publication of the AFL International Association of Machinists, among 150 presidential candidate and said that Gov. Earl Warren of California is the GOP's best bet.

Marren, on the GOP slate, received 74 per cent of the votes followed by Eisenhower with 14.

Among those with one or more votes in the GOP poll were Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York, Gen. Douglas MacArthur, Sen. James H. Duff (Pa.), Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. (Mass.), and Sen. Wayne Morse (Ore.).

Douglas led the Democratic nominee with 47 per cent of the votes.
