### Claire, Ex-Priest Married in Civil Ceremony in Italy

MILAN, Italy — (U.P.) — Claire Mary Young, a 21-year-old American girl who gave up her Chicago home, her U. S. citizenship, and her Catholic faith for love, was married here Thursday in a civil ceremony to Luciano Negrini, a 42-year-old former Priest.

As a result of the marriage both were excommunicated from the Roman Catholic church. • The bride, daughter of a Loyola

university professor in Chicago, renounced her American citizenship Apr. 19. She was excommunicated by the Catholic church for marrying in a civil ceremony Negrini, who spent 15 years in China as a missionary priest, was excommunicated for breaking the canonical law of celibacy, which is binding for life.

The groom, who met the Chicago girl last year while lecturing in the United States, had been defrocked previously for associating with Miss Young. The marriage ceremony, per-

formed in the Milan city hall, lasted only 10 minutes. For Claire, a tall, willowy blonde, this was a "day of triumph

She had spent months of difficulty with required documents, problems of citizenship, lack of money, parental objections, and even a six-day term in Milan's drab San Vittore prison for "Insulting" Italian police.






