Top News Stories of 1951 Aired Tonight on KECA

HOLLYWOOD—A review of the 10 biggest news stories of the year 1951 will be heard on "This Year Around The World," a survey by ABC's news chief John Daly, when aired over KECA at 11 tonight.

The events considered as top 10 very closely paralleled the list selected by CBS radio director of news, Edmund A. Chester. In fact, the three top stories in order of their importance are exactly the same by both men.

Events to be heard tonight include: The MacArthur dismissal and the coverage of his return to the U. S. The on-again off-again attitude of the enemy during the peace talks in Korea and their negotiating attitude.

The story that shocked the nation, cribbing at West Point and the passing of the Army cadet honor system. (Here, the Iranian oil crisis is picked by Chester.) ABC (John Daly) picked for this spot the British election of Churchill by a narrow margin, while CBS (Ed Chester) highlights the internal revenue scandals.

The building of the European defense force by Gen. Eisenhower (CBS names the Woodbridge, N. J. train wreck.) ABC now lists the internal revenue scandals, whereas CBS names the National League pennant race.

The last of the top 10 events to be aired by KECA calls attention to the Woodbridge, N. J. train wreck, while CBS chose to list the Suez Canal crisis. This is remarkable how nearly parallel these two top radio newsmen are with their list of events for 1951.
