Indo-China Reports New Red Buildup
 SAIGON, French Indo-China—(UP)—Communist-led Viet Minh rebels are building up for a major attack on a vital colonial highway in Indo-China, French military sources said Monday.

A French spokesman said the 304th rebel division is massed in the sector between Hoa Binh and Hanoi in the north and the Calaire Choben cliffs in the east, and that an all-out attack on colonial Highway No. 6 might start at any time.

Military sources said the French high command is sending French troops to strengthen French outposts along the whole length of the jungle-covered area.
