SPOTLIGHT

Bach Concerto

TIP O' THE MORNING: Robert Montgomery's daily news summary, "A Citizen Views the News," will begin tonight on WIBA and WIFA-FM. It will be heard at 9:30 p. m. Monday through Friday.

WALTER HEERMANN'S transcription of Bach's cello concerto in G major will be played by Francis Axley and the West High School concert orchestra in West's Winter concert Sunday afternoon.

Written for cello and organ, the work was arranged for cello and piano by Gregor Piatigorsky, then orchestrated by Heermann, who is conductor of the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra and former solo cellist of the Cincinnati Symphony orchestra.

First-chair musicians of the orchestra copied the parts from Heermann's manuscript. The school band and choir also will take part in the concert.

YOUNG ARTISTS: Four young Madison musicians will give a program for the Madison Rotary club at its meeting today in Hotel Lorraine.

Lucille Kubiak, 15-year-old pianist who is a 10th-grade pupil at West high school, will play a Liszt "Hungarian Rhapsody."

She studies with Mrs. J. W. Watson.

Elaine Emordeno, 17 and a senior at Central, will play a marimba number; she is a member of the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra and the Central band and orchestra. Her teacher, Mrs. Theodore Bates, will be accompanist.

Josephine Raimond, 20, will sing "Voi che Sapete" and "L'Amour, Toujours l'Amour" with Dr. Sigfrid Prager as accompanist. She is a pupil of Olive Endres, Madison, and Mmc. Emma Roe, Chicago, and a Central high school graduate.

Ardith Mossman, 17-year-old senior at West and a piano pupil of Maria Syllm, will play Chopin's "Ballade in G Minor." She also plays flute, and has been a member of the All-State high school band and orchestra.

CENTRAL CONCERT: Central senior high school's winter concert will be at 8 p. m. Sunday in the school auditorium, with the band, orchestra, and choir appearing.

Walter Friedrich will conduct the band and orchestra, with Donald Wendlandt directing some numbers, and Darleen McCormick will direct the chorus.

The band will play "Merry Widow March-Paraphrase," Lehara; "Morning, Noon, and Night" overture, von Suppe; "Serenata," Anderson; and "Sleigh Ride," Anderson.

Lorraine Emordeno will play a marimba solo, "Sparks." The orchestra will offer the third-act introduction from "Lohengrin," Brahms; "Andante and Gavotte," Granados; "Rondella Aragonesa No. 2," and Bach's "All Glory Be to God on High."

Chorus numbers will be "Cherubim Song," Borntanski; "Eventide," Pfeil; "Sourwood Mountain," Stone; "Hea's Castle," Harley; "Aschenbrenner," and "May the Good Lord Bless and Keep You," Willson.
