Miss Henriksen, who lives at 732 E. Johnson st. and who is a librarian, will appear with the band at 10:45 in the Crystal ballroom of Hotel Loraine.

The invitational exhibit was arranged by the art education department under Prof. Don Anderson. Other members of the department who worked on the show are Dean Mosker, assistant professor, who arranged for the sculpture; Ruth Severid, instructor, who took charge of the weaving exhibit, and Harvey Littleton, instructor, who arranged for the ceramics.
