
Eating Costs Rise

### CHICKEN CHOWDER

You can have good, low-cost meals by 'cooking ahead'!

In Vermont, there's a wise woman who knows how to cook for company the easy way.

Elinere J. Marvel has put it all in a book, "Cook it Ahead" (Houghton Mifflin). The recipes here are from the book, Mrs. Marvel suggests adding a salad and serving her frozen Apricot Whip for dessert,

#### CHICKEN CHOWDER 1 lablespoon salt pork,

1 large fowl 4 inedium-size onloss Guartered

% bay lead

4 cups diced potatoes 1 package frozen oura

diced i tablespoon salt 1 teaspoon freshly round black pepper 2 quarts rich milk

Place whole fowl, which has been cleaned, into large kettle and add errough holling water to barely cover. Add one of the onions and the bay leaf. Bring to a boil, skim, and reduce heat. Continue cooking slowly until chicken is tender and meat falls off, the bone easily. Strain soup into large bowl. Let chicken cool enough 20 handle, remove skin and bones. Cut meat into large pieces (but not so large they cannot be munaged later in a soup spoon). Return chicken to stock. Do not remove fat, as this is essential to a good chicken chowder. Add remaining onions, potatoes and corn. Cook until vegetables are tender. If using immediately. Try out pork until crisp, add this and milk to chowder, heat through but do not boil. If you are making the chowder for later use, remove from kettle to crockery bowl. Cool, cover, and store in cold place or refrigerator. Return to heat 15 minutes before needed, add milk and pork. (Yield: 6 portions if being used as main course, 8-10 if first course.)

This soup may be kept five or six days without any trouble, as long as the milk is not added. After milk is put in, will keep one or two days.
