NEW YORK—(AP)—Joseph Graber, 38, became the father of quadruplets Monday and all he could say was:

"This is surprising." The quadruplets—three girls and a boy—were born a month prematurely to Graber's 32-year-old wife, Fannie. Mother and children were reported doing well.

Chances of having quadruplets in the U. S. are about 643,971 to one. Graber, a Brooklyn liquor dealer, had been told to expect more than one baby, twins, perhaps, or even triplets.

"I don't know what to say," he gasped. "It's all new to me. What else do you want me to say?" The Grabers have three other children, the oldest 5.

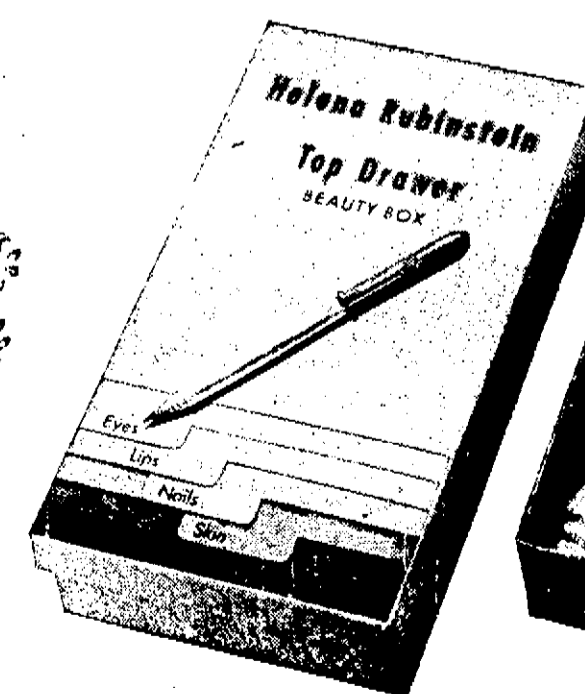
