

A NY PROGRAM OF SONATAS as well performed as those in Music hall Monday night should leave one with a feeling of satisfaction. But the concluding work, Debussy's "Sonata in G Minor," is not the kind of music that has that effect.

In it is a strange nervousness; it upsets one's thoughts and emotions; it has an aura of apprehension. In all this, perhaps, lies its strength.

Albert Rahier, violinist, and Leo Steffens, pianist, were the musicians who presented this, Debussy's last completed work, along with sonatas of Bach and Brahms, They played it with haunting beauty, and gave it the same care and craftsmanship with which the composer had blessed it,

Three more widely separated works than these can hardly be imagined. In the Bach E-major sonata, there was a feeling of formality, even in the dancing second movement, Brahms in A major was rich in melody and escaped lushness in the setting by the narrow line that edges genius.

Rahier, a member of the Pro Arte quartet, and Steffens professor in the University of Wisconsin music school, com plemented each other perfectly.

In their playing, they helped show the wisdom of Bach in making the violin sonata a work for two complete and separate instruments rather than a violin, piece with accompaniment. Their playing in the gracious, lovely third movement of

the Bach work was particularly fine. Nevertheless, the complementary quality of their performance and of Bach's innovation was most evident in the Brahms sonata, in which the piano starts things moving with the violin only an echo to bits of melody before it becomes a full partner.


