

**SPOTLIGHT** On the Air

**TIP OF THE MORNING:** Members of the Madison Art Assn. will attend a preview of Hallmark Art Award paintings at 3 p. m. Sunday, Mar. 9, in Scanlan hall.

**TONIGHT** will begin a crowded weekend of special broadcasts on Madison radio stations, many of them originating in the city.

On tonight's schedule will be the University of Wisconsin Prom (WIBA at 11:15), a report by Secretary of State Dean Acheson (WIBA and WKOW at 8:30), and high school basketball games on WIBA-FM, WFOV, and WWC.

Saturday's programs will include the Wisconsin Ohio State basketball game at Columbus, on most stations; "The Story of the Dance," with Margaret Webster and Agnes DeMille (WIBA at 2 p. m.); Red Cross programs at 3 and 9:45 p. m. (WIBA), and a salute to the American Automobile Assn.'s 50th anniversary (WIBA at 9:30 p. m.).

Sunday specials will include a tribute to the late Ernest Meyer, former Madison newspaperman (WIBA at 2 p. m.), a concert by the Pro Arte quartet (WHA-FM at 8 p. m.), and Red Cross programs (WIBA at 9:30 and 10:30 p. m.).

In addition, WIBA has obtained permission to broadcast the requiem high mass to be conducted in St. Raphael's cathedral for the Rt. Rev. Mgr. William Mahoney.

The mass will be at 11 a. m. Monday.

The service and a description of it will be carried outside the cathedral through a public address system. WIBA made this arrangement for those persons who wish to attend the mass but who will be unable to find seats.

WIBA also is arranging to broadcast election bulletins Tuesday night, as soon after the polls close as possible.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** The next few days will be busy in the concert and theater fields, too.

The Madison String Sinfonia will play at 8:15 tonight in West high school auditorium, and pupils of Central junior high school will give an operetta at 8 tonight in the Central auditorium. "The Drunkard" will have its last showings at 8 tonight and Saturday night in the American Legion ballroom.

Sunday will bring a concert by the Pro Arte quartet at 8 p. m. in Music hall. The Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo will perform at the Parkway theater at 8 p. m. Monday and Tuesday, and Wisconsin Parkers will present "The Madwoman of Chailion" in the Wisconsin Union theater at 8 p. m. Tuesday through Saturday.

On Saturday, Mar. 8, the Madison Maennerchor will give its centennial concert, and on Sunday, Mar. 9, the University Symphony orchestra will play at 4:15 p. m., with Soulima Stravinsky as piano soloist.

**PIANIST:** Pierre Sancan, young French pianist who will play here next month, has been chosen to appear with Rise Stevens, mezzo-soprano, and Frances Magnee, violinist, in a benefit concert Mar. 7 at the Waldorf-Astoria hotel in New York. Proceeds will go to the National Music League.

This will be the pianist's American debut. He has played in 15 European and African countries, and will give a recital Mar. 13 in Beth El temple auditorium.

**DISCS OF THE DAY:** Columbia has come up with a pair of records due to make the juke-boxes spin, the disc-jockeys happy, and the record-sellers joyous. One is Guy Mitchell's "Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania," done in the manner of his "Truly Fair" and backed by "The Doll with the Sawdust Heart," an old-fashioned arrangement that could give "Pittsburgh" a run if it were promoted right. The other is Jo Stafford's "Ay-Round the Corner," a hillbilly take-off paired with "Heaven Drops Her Curtain Down."

**ART:** Two Madison artists will be among 140 from throughout the United States represented in the fifth annual National Exhibition of Contemporary American Painting at the University of Illinois.

They are Aaron Bohrod, artist-in-residence at the University of Wisconsin, and Prof. John Wilde, of the university's art education faculty.

Bohrod will show "Farm Near Fond du Lac." Wilde's painting is "Further Festivities at the Contessa Sanseverini."

The show will open Saturday.

**ON TELEVISION:** Prof. John E. Willard, of the University of Wisconsin chemistry department, and Ray Stanley, WHA production manager, will present the first of two programs on "Atomic Energy in Peacetime" over WTMJ-TV at 2 p. m. Saturday. The program will be a part of the station's "Education on Parade" series.
