

Jewish Appeal Gets \$2,000,000

CHICAGO — (P) — Jewish community leaders of 16 Midwest states including Wisconsin turned over more than \$2,000,000 to the United Jewish appeal, a leadership conference was told Sunday. David Gottein, acting Israeli ambassador to the United States, said the funds represent an advance installment on 1952 camvance installment on 1952 campaign payments in the Midwest. He said the funds will be used to meet critical food and housing shortages in Israel and to main-tain vital relief programs in other

areas.


