

TIP OF THE MORNING: Another hot entry in the race for the Hit Parade is "The Gandy Dancers' Ball".

MUSIC BY CECIL BURLEIGH IS heard in concert and on the air all too seldom.

Almost every violin pupil learns to play the Madison composer's early works, but one seldom gets the chance to listen to such major composition as "The Ascension," sonata, "Mountain Pictures," Evangeline, and the quartets.

This situation will be remedied somewhat tonight when Jascha Heifetz, violinist, plays Burleigh's "Giant Hills," from a suite called "Nature's Voices" published in 1922.

Heifetz will be guest on "Great Artists" over WIBA and WIBA-FM at 8, as guest with Donald Voorhees' orchestra.

Burleigh is professor of music at the University of Wisconsin. His published works include 35 piano pieces, 34 songs, 92 violin numbers, three string quartets, and several orchestral works.


