

SPOTLIGHT New-Music Clinic

TIP OF THE MORNING: Four film stars soon will be heard regularly on CBS radio: Doris Day, John Wayne, Spring Byington, and Richard Haydn.

FIRST OF A SERIES of music clinics to acquaint band leaders with newly-published music was held last week in Scanlan hall of the Madison Vocational and Adult school; another will be in mid-April.

The clinic was arranged by Charles Faulhaber, president of the Ward-Brodt Music Co. in cooperation with Richard Bardwell, director of the school; Walter Heerman, conductor of the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra; Prof. Raymond F. Dvorak, director of bands at the University of Wisconsin; Warrant Officer Harry Fleig, director of the Trux Field Air Force band, and band directors of Madison's five high schools.

The high school directors were Robert Woolen, East; Ernest Stanke, West; Walter Friedrich, Central; Earnest Justice, Wisconsin, and Don Marcoullier, Edgewood.

Among them, they recruited a band of 45 pieces and the necessary instruments to perform new band music.

Each director attending conducted a number. Besides Woolen, Friedrich, Stanke, Fleig, and Heerman, the directors were: John Hils, Madison East; Ralph James, Madison elementary schools; Robert Williams, Cambridge high; Cornelius Walker, Trux Field; Franklin Elze, Lake Mills high; Roger Melree, Lodi high; James Berg, Prairie du Sac high; Don Wendlandt, university; Elmer Ziegler, Madison Vocational; George Kellner, Waterloo high; William Druckenmiller, university, and Emmet Barig, university extension.
