**SPOTLIGHT** Pierre Sancan

**TIP OF THE MORNING:** Success of "The Greatest Show on Earth" undoubtedly will bring out a rash of other films about circuses.

**VIRGIL THOMSON**, music critic of the New York Herald Tribune, found Pierre Sancan, French pianist, an impeccable musician when he made his New York debut Friday night.

Sancan will play at 8:15 tonight in Beth El temple auditorium, 2702 Arbor dr.

The New York program included Schubert's "Impromptu Variations" and three Debussy "Preludes" (among other things), all of which are on his Madison program. He will also play his own "Romantic Caprice," two Bach chorales, Schumann's "Papillons," Liszt's "Legende," and two Chopin works tonight.

In the Schubert and Debussy pieces, Sancan "revealed a musicianship impeccable and a technique adequate," Thomson wrote.

"He did not play false notes, misrepresent familiar musical shapes, or engage in any meretricious display. Modesty, seriousness, and a great competence seemed to be his offering, rather than any unusually powerful platform spirit."

**ON AND OFF THE CAMPUS:** Two University of Wisconsin men will speak at New York art conference next week. James A. Schwabach, extension specialist in art and design, will address a conference on museum art programs for children Mar. 20 at the Brooklyn museum. His subject will be "Art on the Air." Schwabach originated the Wisconsin School of the Air course, "Let's Draw."

Prof. Fred Logan, art education, will lead a discussion of "The College Teacher's Role in Art Education" at the 10th annual conference of the Committee on Art Education at the Museum of Modern Art Mar. 21.

Aaron Bohrod, artist-in-residence, has gone to New York, where his one-man show will be on exhibition until Mar. 29 at the galleries of the Associated American Artists. It includes 20 recent oils and a group of drawings.

"University Art Program," a movie made on the campus last summer for showing in Germany by the U. S. state department, will be screened at 4:30 p. m. Monday in the Wisconsin Union theater. All university students and faculty members and their friends are invited.

Four films produced by the bureau of visual instruction and photographic laboratory of the extension division have been sent to South America. Prof. W. A. Wittich, bureau director, has announced. The departments of German and philology cooperated in the productions, which use a new technique of repetition and closeups in teaching the German language.

**CHICAGO:** If you're in Chicago this week, don't miss a chance to see the retrospective exhibition of Paul Cezanne's work in the Art Institute. This show, regarded by many as one of the most important in many years, consists of works borrowed from private collections throughout Europe and the U. S.

Near it in the East wing galleries is a small exhibition explaining Cezanne's work.

Both will close Sunday. Two plays and a musical make up the current Chicago playbill. "Guys and Dolls" is at the Shubert, "Bell, Book, and Candle" at the Great Northern (closing April 5), and "The Moon Is Blue" at the Harris.

You can buy tickets for "Guys and Dolls" by visiting the Western Union office here. The company will telegraph your reservations and payment and get you an acknowledgment.

The Harris will experiment with an earlier curtain time for out-of-town showgoers. On Tuesday, Mar. 18, and Tuesday, Mar. 25, "The Moon Is Blue" will start at 7:30 p. m. and will end at 9:40 p. m.

Coming attractions include "Ice-Capades of 1952" at the Arena starting Mar. 24 and closing Apr. 9 and the Chicago Negro Opera Guild in "Faust" at the Opera house Mar. 29.
