

Trucking Firm Settles State Suit for \$15,528
A \$15,528 settlement of a \$20,000 Wisconsin Motor Vehicle Department suit against the Central Wisconsin Transportation Co., Wisconsin Rapids trucking firm for truck license payments, was approved Thursday by Circuit Judge Herman W. Sachjen. The two-year-old court dispute involved Motor Vehicle Commissioner Ben L. Marcus' claim that the Central Wisconsin firm had continued to do business in Wisconsin while evading state tax payments here by transferring its holdings to an Illinois corporation. With the tax case settled by stipulation, the trucking firm officials said they planned to dis-solve their Wisconsin corporation and incorporate with an Illinois corporation.

PATRICIA KING ADDED A star to her acting crown Thursday night when she played Rosalind in William Shakespeare's comedy, "As You Like It," at West high school. Mrs. King, when she was Patricia McKune, had won the crown last season with her interpretation of the cockney girl of "The Corn Is Green" and had done noteworthy work with Blackfriars Guild.

Her Rosalind was by turns a lovesick girl, a pert minx, and something of a philosopher; Mrs. King was always a smooth comedienne, lovely to look at and expert in turning a line.

Paired with her as Celia was Lou Dorlag, as adept at abetting her comedy as a good football player is at running interference for the ball carrier. She won a few chuckles herself.

"As You Like It" depends almost wholly on these two characters, although it needs a clever Jaques to deliver the most famous lines of the comedy—those about "all the world's a stage." And the Madison Theater Guild had the right man in Prof. Mark Eccles, who tossed them off as integral parts of the play rather than as too many actors do reading them as a coloratura aria.

Russell Shank and Marjorie Schaeffer crowned superbly as Touchstone and Audrey, respectively. Miss Schaeffer's first appearance—a wordless dash over the stage's ramp—created the heartiest laugh of the show.

John Barness played the handsome Orlando, Rosalind's sweetheart, with suitable passion, and Richard Dillon was a truly foppish LeBeau. Gene King needed only to flex his muscles and do a flip to win applause as the husky wrestler, and Stanley Spencer was good as the dull bumpkin, William.

This was the smoothest production Al Barraclough has given us since he took over as Guild director. Except for a few sequences in the first act, he made the many scenes dovetail well, in spite of the changes in time and place which the single setting and the absence of a curtain left to the audience's imagination. The lighting crew's effective work helped take care of this.

Costuming was one of the show's best features. The play will be repeated at 8:15 tonight in West high school and at 2:30 and 8:15 p.m. Saturday in East high school.

KOLISCH ON SCHOENBERG: By request of the British Broadcasting Co. (BBC), a recording of Rudolf Kolisch's lecture on the life and work of Arnold Schoenberg, his brother-in-law, has been sent to WHA.

It will be broadcast by BBC stations during a Schoenberg festival this month.

Kolisch became a pupil of the composer in 1919, and soon was his assistant in the Society for the Performance of Contemporary Music in Vienna. Since then, he has been a leader in the performance and interpretation of Schoenberg's music.

Kolisch has been first violinist of the Pro Arte quartet of the University of Wisconsin since 1944.
