"Over 200 black-and-white and eight full-page color photographs have been selected for the book from the work of Baron, official photographer for the Sadler's Wells Co. at Convent Gardens and Ballet Theater when it was in London," the library says.

"The book, which is one of the most comprehensive collections of ballet photographs by one man, was purchased for the Planey collection of art and finely illustrated books with income from the Charles Hathaway library endowment fund.

"Pictures illustrate ballet in Britain, France, and America, dealing not only with classical ballet such as 'Ciselle' and 'Lac des Cygnes,' but modern ballets such as 'Carmen,' 'Symphonic Variations,' 'Pillar of Fire,' and 'Le Jeune Homme et la Mort.'"

## City Alderman Appeals Assessment to Court

Atty. Carroll E. Metzner, 733 Huron hill, 20th ward alderman, started action in Circuit Court late Wednesday afternoon contesting the city of Madison's 1950 assessment of \$1,700 on a vacant lot facing Council Crest which adjoins the Metzner's home property.

Metzner claimed that the \$1,700 assessment for the 50 by 100-foot lot was \$600 over the 1949 assessment and that the fair market value of the lot would not exceed \$800, which he paid for it in 1949.

Circuit Judge Herman W. Sachtjen ordered Metzner and City Atty. Harold Hanson to file briefs within 20 days before he decides if the assessment should be reduced.

## Reuss Urges French to Leave Indo-China

Eau Claire—Henry Reuss, running for the Democratic nomination to the U. S. Senate says that in order to save Indo-China from Communists the French must get out.

Reuss spoke at Eau Claire Tuesday night.

"One reason for our failure in China was our half-hearted support of an unpopular and reactionary regime," he said.

"In Indo-China, we're supporting, in a half-hearted way, an unpopular and reactionary French colonial administration."

Reuss urged that the U. S. ask the French to relinquish all claim to Indo-China and that a UN trusteeship be set up until the Indo-Chinese can establish their own government.
