**TIP 'O' THE MORNING:** Television's huge production costs are causing fresh headaches in the industry. In at least two cases, networks are seriously considering repeating winter programs this summer, via film.

**Scanlan Hall Show Called 'First-Rate'**

At the Willenstein gallery in New York, the Hallmark Art Award was simply another excellent painting show in a city where one may contemplate the world's finest on any day of his choosing. At Scanlan Hall in Madison, we have all too rare opportunity of seeing a first-rate international contemporary exhibition.

Lavishly endowed by the Hallmarks collecting card firm, and attended by extensive publicity, it had American and French artists competing separately to form a joint exhibition on the theme of Christmas with 10 very generous awards in each group. The traveling show as we see it consists of these 20 prize winners.

Understandably first in the American group, and outstanding all told, "Mother and Child" by Fred Conway would be worth the trip to see it were it exhibited elsewhere. An encyclopedic painting of a mother and child, it combines the traditional tender madonna theme with strong, ascending abstract forms. Members of the Madison Art Assn., will remember Mr. Conway as the very intriguing jester of their show a year ago.

The second American award, "Boy with Toys," by Mitchell Siplorin, seems dark without compensating strength of color, and somewhat contradictory in the treatment of isolated detail in a nebulous space.

In his American third-prize winner "Three Kings," Edmund Lewandowski depends on a correct knowledge of modern pictorial composition, so correct indeed that the results seem obvious and superficial.
