

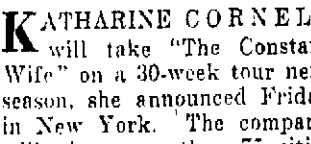

will take "The Constant Wife" on a 30-week tour next season, she announced Friday in New York. The company will play more than 75 cities from coast to coast in the longest road trip Miss Cornell has made since the 1933-34 season.

That year, she took a repertory of three plays to 77 cities. The Somerset Maugham play will close its Broadway run on April 5. After a rest, the show will reopen April 14.

In Philadelphia, then will play Washington and Boston before the cast disbands for the summer. The fall tour will open Oct. 16 in Miss Cornell's native city, Buffalo, N. Y.

In "The Constant Wife," Miss Cornell co-stars with Brian Aherne and Grace George, who will also be in the touring company. Others on the road will be John Emery, Gertrude Musgrove, and Eva Leonard-Boyne.

Originally produced by Miss Cornell with the same company last August for the 15th anniversary of the Central City, Colo., Festival of Music and Drama, "The Constant Wife" broke a boxoffice and attendance record for that Rocky Mountain summer resort and its opera house. Including its summer run, Miss Cornell and her troupe will have performed "The Constant Wife" 243 times before they call it a season.
