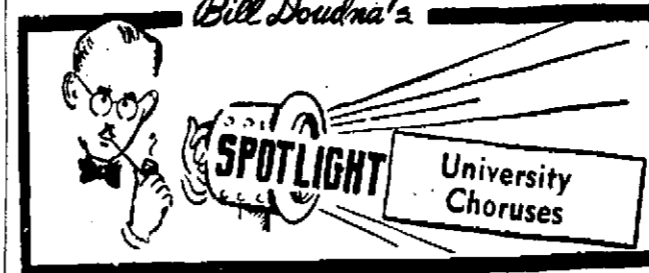

EVEN WITHOUT ITS OTHER qualities, Sunday night's concert by the University of Wisconsin Men's and Women's choruses would have been notable for its choice of music.

The women sang a beautiful "Ave Maria," but it was Kodaly's, not Schubert's nor the Bach-Gounod; the men offered a stirring Handel chorus, but it was "Let Their Celestial Concerts All Unite," not the "Hallelujah Chorus."

Under Prof. Helene Blotz, the women's chorus sang the Kodaly work with a lovely delicacy; Chaminade's "The Silver Ring" and "Scher Eres," a Palestinian song, with fine ensemble effects and a fullness which was missing in other offerings.

The men gave excellent accounts of "O Filii et Filiae," by the 17th century's Leisring; the Handel work, with an unusual sweetness in the first tenors; the humorous "Oliver Delancey," a "swinging" new song, and the quietly dramatic "A Stopwatch and an Ordinance Map," by Samuel Barber.

Together, the choruses sang excerpts from "La Belle Helene" with great good humor, first-rate balance, and rhythmic accuracy. Prof. Paul Jones conducted the Offenbach music, as well as "Hello, Young Lovers" and Youmans' "Hit the Deck."
