After 31 years in some phase of the horse racing profession, Fred will hit the "world series of the race track" this weekend. He got into the racing business when he went to work for the Brooklyn Eagle. Then he was turf editor of the New York Post for eight years. "Cappy" entered radio in 1933 when NBC signed him to cover feature races at three tracks.

In addition, he has been inspector for the New York state racing commission, announcer at Hialeah Park for the past seven years, and announcer for all New York Racing Assn. tracks for the last nine years.

He credits two things for his accuracy in covering races—his keen eyesight and his ability to memorize names and associate them with jockeys' colors.
