NEW form of interference probably will appear Thursday on television receivers. It will be caused by amateur radio operators-through no fault of their own.

"Hams" on that day will begin using the new 21-megacy le frequency granted them by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), reports the American Radio Relay League ARRL).

"There isn't much of anything amateurs can do about it. ARRL says, "since the primary cause will be pickup of their adio signals by some internal circuits of the receiver which have been tuned to the new amateur frequency.

"This internal-receiver frequency was chosen by the television ndustry in 1945 over the protests of ARRL. Manufacturers eventualfound it unsuitable and many of them have recently changed their tandard to a channel less susceptible to interference, but millions of ets were produced with the 21-megacycle circuit.

"According to tests conducted by the engineering staff of the ague in 1948, such receivers may experience severe interference rom amateur stations in the neighborhood, even though transmitters re operating fully in compliance with FCC regulations. The 1948 ests, performed with a special experimental license provided by FCC, nowed that the only remedy was a realignment of the internal cirntry of the receiver, a modification which fortunately can be perrmed by any competent service-technician.

"ARRL General Manager A. L. Budlong has called upon all manfacturers of television receivers to see to it that suitable remedies re made or authorized in cases where 21-megacycle operation by an mateur station causes interference to a receiver using the old indusy standard on that channel. He said that several companies have lready set a policy of modifying the receiver to provide satisfactory levision reception in such cases."


