'Alice in Dairyland'

CONTESTANTS for the title of "Alice in Dairyland" have been invited by Vaughn Monroe to be his guests at the "Alice in Dairyland Ball" Wednesday night in the Riverview ballroom, Sauk City. Girls who want to enter the competition will find entry blanks at the ball.

Monroe's orchestra will play for the dancing.

A half-hour of the event will be broadcast by WKOW at 10:45 p. m. The program will feature interviews with Monroe, members of his company, and probably some of the contestants.

The contest will close Saturday.

'TRUDY': Gertrude Stillman, who is "Trudy" to the thousands of school children who listen to "Journeys in Music Land," will teach a radio course in music appreciation during the 1952-53 school year.

Mrs. Stillman's "Music Time" will replace "Music Enjoyment," which Mrs. Elyda Morphy has conducted for 16 years. Mrs. Morphy retired last week. The new program, designed for children in grades 1 through 4, will include dramatizations, instrument studies, and stories about composers.

It will be on WHA and the state network at 1:30 p. m. Thursdays, beginning Sept. 25, as a part of the "Wisconsin School of the Air."

Another new "School of the Air" program will be "Wisconsin Almanac," to be heard at 1:30 p. m. Mondays, beginning Sept. 22. It will tell the story of Wisconsin's development as a state, using dramatizations and documentaries about men and women who have stimulated its progress.

Returning will be "Afield With Ranger Mac," "Growing Up," "Young Experimenters," "Rhythm and Games," "Let's Draw," "Journeys in Music Land," "News of the Week," and "Book Trails."

They will come from Manitowoc, Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, Racine, Kenosha, Green Bay, Wausau, Marinette, Menasha, and Milwaukee.

Democrat Editor, Two DOC Men Resign

The editor of the Wisconsin Democrat and two district Democrat Organizing Committee (DOC) chairmen have turned in their resignations to the DOC administrative committee.

Warren Sawall, editor of the DOC's monthly tabloid for the past two years, said his resignation was for "personal reasons" and that he had no immediate plans to announce. He will leave the Democrat the first of July.

Ray Robertson, Oshkosh, sixth district DOC chairman, and Sen. Henry Maier, Milwaukee, head of the fifth district, also announced their intention to quit those posts at a DOC administrative meeting at Milwaukee Sunday.

Robertson told the group he couldn't spare the time from his work. Maier said he has other political activities this year that will keep him busy.
